

Program: Lori Friedman introduced this evening's speaker, Arlene Sachitano, a local writer/quilter. Her books are quilt related. Her informative lecture was about each book she has written. Arlene presented quilts that were made based on her books.

Announcements and Committee Reports:

Storage Unit: President Kathy Anderson asked for volunteers to help organize the storage unit on Tuesday, June 12.

Comforting Quilts: Carol Brown announced that she has quilt kits, in a variety of sizes, that need to be made and quilts that need binding. She also announced that because the July workday falls on July 4th, it has been rescheduled to July 11. Lastly, it was announced that we are 50 quilts ahead of last year's donation, which was 2,563.

Fiscal Year: Kathleen Schmidt, Treasurer, announced that our fiscal year ends on June 30th. She needs vouchers for reimbursement by then. Kathleen also announced that it is time to renew your guild membership.

New Member Mentor Program: Joyce Swift announced that mentors are needed for new members. Please contact her if you are interested.

Challenge Quilt: Melody Burchyski announced that this year's winner is Ruth Purcell.

The quilt was longarmed by Jane Ratcliff. Kathy Anderson will be the Travel Agent for the quilt.

Block of the Month: Liz Hinze won the boat blocks.

Door Prizes: Seven were drawn.

Show and Tell: 7 quilts were shown.





QUILTER'S OFFER OF PIGS ON A BLANKET ACCEPTED

Violet Roetcisoender of Lenore Iowa, found the perfect home for a pig-themed quilt she made: a classroom in Iowa with an emotional support pig named Frankie.

Violet Roetcisoender is a quilter who has pieced together a market that stretches all the way to the Midwest, where she recently found the perfect recipients for a hard-to-place quilt.

The 91-year-old Lenore resident said she has enough children, grandchildren and now great-grandchildren to give most of her work a home. She makes 35 to 50 quilts a year. "So I need the demand, so to speak," Roetcisoender said.

That means sewing quilts when she feels like it, with whatever material she has available, including fabric her daughter gave her with little pigs on it. A quilt made with the porcine pattern sat homeless

for at least 11/2 years before she figured out where it was meant to be.

"It was darling, but I wasn't sure if it would go over with everyone," Roetcisoender said. The quilt-maker knew not every family member or new mother would want a blanket adorned with pigs. So the pig quilt waited.

While reading through the Lewiston Tribune, Roetcisoender came across a story about a school that used a therapy pig to help calm students experiencing distress. The students at Franklin Elementary School in Muscatine, Iowa, would read to the



pig to calm down.

Shortly thereafter, a lightbulb clicked on for Roetcisoender, and she knew where to send the quilt.

"I got a letter back from them saying yes, they got it. Yes, they use it in the classroom. And yes, they read with it. No, they didn't get in trouble for having a pig in the classroom," Roetcisoender said. "Iowa is famous for its piggies I guess."

Whether it's her own family, students in Lenore or students in Iowa, Roetcisoender has their quilt needs covered and is kept busy with requests. "I let my grandkids heckle me that way," she said.

You might bring your machine to piece, machine applique, or machine quilt a smallish item, or you could bring a hand project, like binding, hand quilting, hand applique, English paper piecing, or embroidery. The biggest responsibility is to talk to fair attendees about your project, our guild, or quilting in general, and hopefully to allow them to participate by designing or sewing or learning a new-to-them technique. You will get free admission to the Fair for the day, and we'll even give you a break to go out on the grounds for Fair food. Other Community Outreach events: We would love to have a list of Northwest Quilters members who are willing to participate in various events throughout the


Korn, Jackie Nance, Jane Ratcliff, and Brenda Youngson for awarding QOVs at various venues.

BOARD MEETING - June 4th, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:40 by president Kathy Anderson.

Announcement: Kathy Anderson told us that Pattie McNulty is quite ill and can no longer continue as our Webmaster. Jane Ratcliff, our Social Media Chair, will be taking over the website.

Old Business:

Kathy Anderson and her husband will be buying the storage unit shelving that was approved at the May board meeting and arranging with Home Depot to have it installed before Bob Eldred returns from his trip.

Treasurer's Report:

-Kathleen Schmidt received a voice mail message from Rosemary that the ticket tally from the quilt show of \$40.40 will be included in the final closing bill from the Expo Center. She was told that the bill was closed on Friday. She thinks we should get a refund. As of now, the Hollywood bill for lights, pipes, drapes, etc. has not been received. The Guild should clear \$3900 from the show. Last year's amount was \$8000, but this year there were 300 fewer people in attendance, and expenses were higher, with more quilts costing more to display. The vendor income was about the same. We had fewer vendors, but some took a larger space and several took \$1000 sponsorships. There will be a show wrap up meeting at the end of June at Bob Eldred's home.

-Next year's show date was again discussed and seems to still be in

flux.

- The Budget year officially starts July 1st. Budget requests need to be approved by the August board meeting. If committee chairs do not submit a changed request by then, their budget will remain the same as this year. If they need help with the budget, they should get in touch with Kathleen.

Committee Reports:

• Myra Turley, *Patchword*. Ads make us some money for the *Patchword*. She has a new expense for Adobe InDesign. Her old copy was no longer useful, and she had to sign up for an annual subscription with Adobe at the cost of \$19.99/month. It was moved and seconded to reimburse her for the past costs of this subscription, which started in January of this year, and to include the cost in her future budget. The motion was approved. She will provide a receipt to Kathleen.

• Carol Brown, *Comforting Quilts*. November meeting will be Jelly Bean quilt making on November 12th, with setup the night before. The church liaison, Barbara, will again be provided with a schematic for the layout of the various stations. Kathy Anderson has a quilt to donate to CQ, but it needs to have some hand quilting finished. She will ask at the general meeting if anyone can finish it for CQ. Kathleen Schmidt will deliver the check to Mill End for the space we rent for *Comforting Quilts*.

• Carol Hull, Retreat co-chair. 25 people were at the spring retreat.

- There is only one registration for the summer retreat on July 22-25. We will take registrations at the June meeting, and Kathleen will bring the Credit Card machine, to facilitate. Mary Fitzgibbons will do an email blast for the retreat within one week of the June meeting. Registrations must be in by July 8. We must have 16 participants to break even. It will be on our own Facebook page.

- Fall retreat is Oct 18-21. Weekends are more expensive, and Tillikum has lowered the number of registrations we need. Spring Retreat is scheduled for March 21-24 but this may conflict with the new date for our Quilt show, and also the Milwaukie quilt show.

- We are looking for replacements for the two co-chairs. Carol and JoAnn will stay on through the summer and fall retreat but would like to have replacements by the spring retreat. A transition period would be ideal, if replacements can be found now. They will look at people that come to retreats all the time.

- It was moved and seconded that the email blast be sent out for the Summer retreat.

• Mary Fitzgibbons, Membership Chair. Mary reported that 89 people attended the May meeting, with 51 renewals at the time. Kathleen added that 78 people have renewed as of today.

- The *Patchword* was emailed to 225 people, with a new Google account to send from, and 20 hard copies were mailed to the members that have requested them.

Mary found that the 82nd St Office Max will copy them for us for \$.026 per page, which was a relief to her.

- She is ready for the June meeting, with renewal forms for current business and regular members and new member forms and packets. Evelyn Eason has agreed to help her at the sign in table, and Kathleen will be there to accept credit card payments for memberships.

- Door prizes were discussed and selected for the June meeting, and Carol Hull will be shopping for retreat door prizes and will pick up some for the August general meeting. These will come out of Membership monies.

- Joyce Swift has a new member that would like to help with the Roster update. Mary will coordinate with her. Printing and distribution will be done by Membership.

- Myra Turley said she will type up the trifold brochure if one can

be found for her as an example. Mary believes Bob knows where the master is as he mentioned it is being taken care of. She will check with him when he gets back.

- New membership packets. No one seems to know where the guild pin that is included comes from, nor the fabric patch for making a name tag. Joyce Swift will take on getting the new membership packets ready.

• Joyce Swift, New Members coordinator, said 3 new members joined in April and 14 in May, including one from PA and one from Salem that are interested in retreats, and there are 5 new mentors. She feels the program is progressing nicely.

• Lori Friedman, Programs/Workshops Chair, is excited to be introducing the June speaker, who is a friend. Lori sold one of the donated quilts on eBay, and was contacted by a person who is going to try to sell some at a live internet auction. His commission will be 13%.

Laura Wasilowski's workshops were great fun, but not very well attended. The large room at the church was not very good for the workshops because of the echo-


ing and because of other groups using the church kitchen and library at the same time. Church facility use and problems with the liaison will be discussed with the church.

Joyce Swift thanked Kathy Anderson for all of us for her serving as our president this year, and for the lovely gifts she sewed for us, and the great cookies she baked.

The next Board meeting will be Monday, August 6, 6:30pm, at Sellwood Community Center. The meeting was adjourned at 8:10pm. *The meeting location has been changed to a private home because the Community Center is not available that date.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH - August, Scrap it up with Big Blocks

Fabric & supplies needed


- 1½" x 16 bright strips at least 7" long
- 2" x 8 bright strips at least 7" long
- Two 10" squares of black solid or black on black
- 6½" square ruler (optional)
- Sew at ¼" seam



Sew bright strips together. Make a set of 4 strips using the 1½" strips, add one each of the 2" strips to the right and left side, Press seams on one direction.

Use the 6 ½" ruler and trim down, make 4 of these sets and then make 1 large 4 patch. Make opposite corners vertical and horizontal. (see photo above).

Next, take the 10" squares x 2, cut corner to corner on the diagonal. Fold triangle in half, point to point to make a crease line. Line up the crease with the middle of the 4 patch seam. Sew the top and bottom, then right and left triangles. Press seams to the dark side, square up and trim the block leaving ½" at each point.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH - September, Scrap it up with Log Cabin Balls

Fast, fun & easy

Fabric needed: Dark and medium scraps: 2" strips various lengths.

Neutral fabric scraps: 2" center square & 1 ¼" strips various lengths

In the traditional log cabin construction: Use ¼" seam

- Sew light center to #1 dark print, press, and trim to align with the center block. (follow numbers in photo below)
- Sew #2 dark print, press, trim.
- Sew #3 light print, press, trim. Sew #4 light print, press, trim.
- Sew #5 dark print, press trim. Sew #6 dark print, press, trim.
- Sew #7 light print, press, trim. Sew #8 light print, press, trim.
- Sew #9 dark print, press, trim. Sew #10 dark print, press, trim.
- Sew #11 light print, press trim. Sew #12 light print, press, trim

4 blocks = one ball. Make a few, make a bunch !!


