

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COMFORTING QUILTS

When the word was put out that doll and infant quilts were needed for the Portland Firefighter's Toy & Joy program, NWQ members responded: 760 doll and 82 infant quilts were turned in at the December 1st curbside drop off. They were picked up by Dean Johnston that morning. Therefore, the total number of quilts donated since last December is – drum roll please – 2,105 doll and 352 infant, for a total of 2,457! It is fantastic that our quilts will help make the holiday more cheerful for 2,457 children. A letter has been received from the Toy & Joy program thanking us for “your extra work on quilts this special year when we are celebrating our 106th year. This could not have been done without assistance from organizations like yours”. The only other activity of the CQ

committee in December was the delivery of 104 lap quilts to Nursing Home Ministries, the PNTB (transplant bank), My Father's House, and Signature Hospice.

Communications have been received thanking us for four quilts given to the families of organ donors – 16 lives were saved due to the organs that were donated. To date, NWQ has given 348 quilts to the Pacific Northwest Transplant Bank.

The next curbside drop off will be held at The Mill End Store on January 5th from 10:30 to 11:00. Since the committee is not meeting due to the COVID-19 activity freeze, we will not be preparing any orders for supplies to be picked up. We ask that quilts are finished by quilting, machine tacking or

tying if possible. We need older youth throws sized very close to 45" x 60". Also, keep making doll and infant quilts for next year so we don't have to put the pedal to the metal as holiday season 2021 approaches.

Recipient highlight: Parry Center – when a child's mental health challenges become so severe they are unable to cope at home or in school, psychiatric residential services are provided in an intensive, around-the-clock setting. The goal of all residential services is to successfully prepare and transition children back to their families and communities.





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THE CHALLENGE OF THE CHALLENGE QUILT

Happy New Year! The new year is a time for new beginnings, resolutions and new challenges. Looks like we will all be continuing our "staying at home time" for at least a few more months. What a good time to take on a challenge. There is still plenty of time to request and complete your little Challenge Quilt.

Contact me sewingmelody@gmail.com to request an entry packet, which includes a piece of vintage fabric to be included in your quilt.

Why vintage fabric in this quilt? Since the theme, Use it Up, Wear it Out, Make it Do, or Do Without,

was developed in 1944, why not use fabric from that era! One easy way to identify vintage fabric is by the width. Fabric width has increased over time. In 1915 fabric was woven at under 24". In the 1920's to 1930's fabric was 30" to 34". In the 1940's and 1950's fabric ranged from 36" to 39". Since the 1960's fabric is 45", although it seems to be getting narrower again, with selvages getting WIDER! One notable holdout is Liberty of London lawn still being manufactured in 36".

The fabric included in the Challenge Quilt entry packet is 36" wide and was gathered over many years. There are a wide variety of

small prints, florals and a few novelty designs. If you are interested in seeing fabrics from the 1800's through the 60's take a look at: Sharon's Antiques: Vintage Fabrics and Antique Textiles rickrack.com.

Let's see how the vintage fabrics provided are used in this year's 9"x12" small quilts!

VIRTUAL GENERAL MEETING MINUTES - December 14th, 2020

The virtual meeting was called to order at 7:03pm by President Denise Gies. Fifty-four members were present.

Program: Denise introduced our guest, Maria Shell, speaking from Anchorage, Alaska. Her talk, "Traditional, Art, Modern – Notes from the Field", addressed the three main genres of quilting, how they are defined, and how quilters' interpretations of these definitions have evolved in recent years. Do we need to define ourselves as a particular type of quilter? Can our quilts fit into multiple categories? She concluded with Bill Volkening's advice - call yourself a 21st century quilter. Don't let the definitions define you.

Committee reports:

Sue Hatt, Comforting Quilts – expressed thanks for the tremendous response to their appeal for doll and infant quilts. Dean Johnston, from Toy & Joy, collected 760 doll quilts and 82 infant quilts at Mill End Store on December 1. In 2020, a total of 2105 doll quilts and 352 infant quilts were donated. Comforting Quilts also distributed 104 lap and throw quilts to four other agencies on December 1. The current focus is on finished throws (45" x 60") suitable for teenagers, as well as doll quilts for next year's Toy & Joy.

Maureen Orr Eldred, Community Outreach – reported that they have awarded ten Quilts of Valor

since our last meeting. She also thanked all the volunteers who continue sewing for QOV.

Mary Fitzgibbons, Membership – reported 204 current members, and two who joined this month via internet. Door prize winners for December are Susan Avery, Sharon Skates and Mary Lindstrom.

Joyce Swift, New Member Program – reported that fourteen members have joined within the last twelve months. The next new member gathering is Saturday, December 19, from 1-2 pm. Joyce will send an email with the link to new members. All other members are welcome to attend as well; the link can be found on the NWQ website.

Carrie Perkins, Raffle quilt – Thus far 69 tickets have been sold, for a total of \$239. Jane Ratcliff reminded members that tickets can be purchased online at the NWQ website.

Barbara Mason, Retreats – Given the state of the pandemic, Barbara does not think a retreat at Tilikum in March is possible, and she will plan on a virtual retreat. This was reinforced by the informal poll that Jane posted during the meeting, a majority of respondents expressing a preference for a virtual retreat. Denise welcomed any interested members to contact Barbara to help with the planning.

Announcements:

- **Speakers** – Denise solicited feedback from members regarding guest speakers and potential workshops; Jane posted a poll on this during the meeting.
- **Challenge Quilts** – Denise reminded people to contact Melody Burchyski for guidelines and the required fabric.
- **Directions for the next round of the "Make it Up as you Go" medallion quilt** will be in the January *Patchword*.
- Jane Ratcliff reported that Google Meets has made some changes that should improve user experience and that all of our regular meetings will use that platform. Links can be found on the NWQ website.

Block of the month: Maureen Orr Eldred won the December "Star Flower" blocks. The pattern for the January "Wintery Flower" block can be found in the *Patchword*.

Show-and-tell: Photos of eleven quilts were shared, as well as eighteen doll quilts and a pair of embroidered "handsocks" made by Helene Knott.

The next general meeting will be Monday, January 11 at 9:30am. The board meeting will follow. The meeting was adjourned at 9:04pm.

When we are finally able to meet and get together in person again, we will have some other positions that will need attention and volunteers





others are working on.

MAKE IT UP AS YOU GO - Second Pieced Round



Our Second Resting Border:

Before we start choosing our pieced blocks, we are going to add the second resting border to our medallion.

Let's start with measuring again to make sure that your medallion currently measures **28 ½"** square. If you are spot on, congratulations! If you are off a bit, don't panic... I have a formula for you that will bring you back to where we need to be before adding the pieced border.

You choose which of your fabrics you want to use... your background? One of your colors? Remember this is your quilt and you are making it up as you go!

Current Size	Cut your border strips
If your medallion is 28 ½" square	Cut your strips 2 ½" wide - 2 @ 28 ½" & 2 @ 32 ½" long
If your medallion is 29" square	Cut your strips 2 ¼" wide - 2 @ 29" & 2 @ 32 ½" long
If your medallion is 28" square	Cut your strips 2 ¾" wide - 2 @ 28" & 2 @ 32 ½" long
Is your medallion is in between these measurements?.... 28 ¼" of 28 ¾" ? Try this...	You can over cut your borders just a tad, and then once they are applied, trim them just a smidge to bring you to the needed 32 ½" square. Just make sure they are trimmed equally so that they are all the same going around.

I pressed towards the resting borders, which will help reduce the seam bulk. After you have stitched on the resting border your quilt should measure **32 ½"** square.



Choosing the Second Pieced Round:

Each month, we present two different pieced borders to add to your medallion. You can choose either one or the option you didn't choose the last time, or you can go rogue and pick something different. (*Choosing to go rogue means you are on your own for block instructions.*)

MAKE IT UP AS YOU GO - Second Pieced Round, continued

Round 2 Choices: 4" finished blocks Unfinished = 4 1/2"

You will need a total of 36 blocks for this round

"Chevrons" using Half Square Triangles	"Triangle in a Square" Using Tri-Recs Ruler
	
	

These instructions are very simple, with no pictures. They are basic quilt blocks, and if you want to find detailed stitching instructions, look in one of your basic quilt books or check out Google & YouTube.

For the Half Square Triangles:

Make 19 of one color and 17 of another

Cut 5 1/2" strips of each color. Then sub-cut into 10 (Ten) 5 1/2" squares of first color
9 (nine) 5 1/2" squares of your second color, and 19 squares of your neutral color.

Place a neutral square & a colored square right sides together. Draw a line diagonally on the lightest color.

Stitch 1/4" on each side of the drawn line. Cut on the line, and press seam towards the darkest fabric

Trim if to 4 1/2" unfinished. *Note: This is just one way to make Half Square Triangles. If you have another preferred method, just use those instructions to make what you need.*

MAKE IT UP AS YOU GO - Second Pieced Round, continued

For Triangle in a Square Units : (This will require a set of Tri-Recs Rulers)

Start with accurate 4 ½” strips.

Cut 4 (four) squares 4 ½” of the color you want to put in the corners (This was my yellow)

Cut 32 (Thirty-two) triangles out of your first color (My yellow)

Cut 64 (Sixty-four) triangle wings out of the second color (My blue). Make sure that you are getting both a Left sided wing and a Right sided wing for each of your large triangles by folding your strips with right sides facing each other when cutting the wings.

TriRec rulers have a little corner already engineered to cut off when you are cutting. Look closely at the narrowest end on the flat side of your wing template. Remember to trim to match the template when cutting. There are several YouTube videos that demonstrate how to get perfect units.

Stitch the wings to one side of your triangle. Carefully press towards the outer wing so that you don't stretch that bias edge.

Stitch the second wing on the opposite side and carefully press towards the outside.

Trim if necessary, to achieve 4 ½” **unfinished units**. If your unit is too small, use a narrower seam allowance.

Attaching your blocks to your Medallion:

Stitch into 2 rows of 10 blocks & 2 rows of 8 blocks

Attach to your medallion using a ¼” seam. Press towards the resting border you added earlier to reduce bulky seams.

Your project will now measure 40 ½” square.

I like to do a stay stitch 1/8” from the outside edge... this helps to keep my seams going the way I want them to, and keeps the seams from popping while we wait for the next steps.

PS. If your measurements are a bit off, don't panic! Don't cut off any points! We will be able to make that adjustment on your next resting border.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH - January, Wintery Flower

Sort of a snowflake, wintery colored flower.
 Due date: Sunday January 10.
 Email photo(s) of completed blocks to me by due date.

Fabric Choices: Flower – Blues or purples
 Center of flower – Coordinating color
 Background – choose light gray or white

Center:

A – 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Cut 1

Flower:

B – 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Cut 4
 C – 4" x 4" Cut 4 (will yield 8 triangles)

Background:

D – 4" x 4" Cut 4 (will yield 8 triangles)
 E – 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Cut 4
 F – 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Cut 4


Assemble:

Make 1/2 triangle square: Place one C square and one D square right sides together. Draw diagonal line. Sew scant 1/4" seam on both sides of diagonal line. See diagram. Cut along diagonal line. Open and press, then trim to 3 1/2" square.

Repeat with remaining C squares and D squares.
 Sew remaining pieces together following block diagram.



Finished size: 15 1/2" x 15 1/2" to make 15" quilt block.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH - February Valentine Flower

Small, sweet flower.

Due date: Sunday February 7.

Email photo(s) of completed blocks to me by due date.

Fabric Choices:

Flower – Reds or pinks

Background –White

Leaf - Green

Background:

A – 2 ½" x 4 ½" Cut 1

Flower:

B – 2 ½" x 2 ½" Cut 2

C – 2 ½" x 4 ½" Cut 1

D – 2 ½" x 4 ½" Cut 1

Leaf:

E – 2 ½" x 2 ½" Cut 2

Assemble:

Make flying geese blocks using flip and turn method. Place one B block on A rectangle. Stitch, trim seam, and flip. Press open prior to repeating with second B block on other end of A rectangle.


Repeat using E blocks on D rectangle.

Sew blocks together following block diagram. Now admire your masterpiece!



Finished size: 4 ½" x 6 ½" to make 4" x 6" quilt block.


