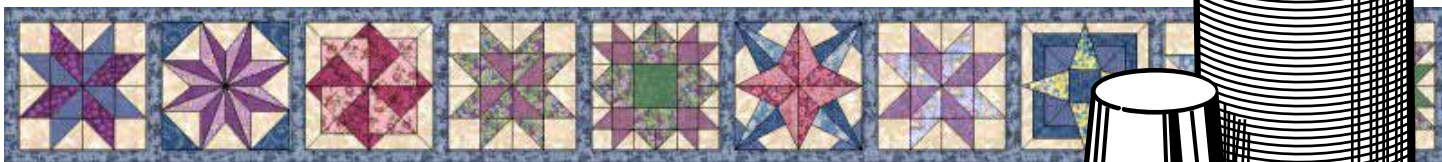

COMFORTING QUILTS

The May workday was very productive, thanks to the 24 people who attended. Kits were made, tops were processed into quilts ready for finishing, and quilts were finished by tying. Everyone's efforts were greatly appreciated. The next workday will be on June 6 and although there is no general meeting or Patchword in July, the July workday will be held. The usual day falls on the 4th of July, so the workday will be held on July 11 – mark your calendars now.

The quilt sizes that we currently need are infant, crib, and lap. It is very helpful if those smaller quilts are completely finished by tying,

machine tacking, or machine quilting when handed in. We thank those of you who are able to finish the quilts.

We appreciate all the people who helped with the Build-A-Block booth and tying frame at the show – from set up, during show hours, and take down. Thank you so much!

Recipient highlight: Habitat for Humanity works with qualified, low-income families to help them realize the dream of owning their own home. After completing 300 sweat equity hours, families sign an affordable mortgage and make

monthly payments that are based on no more than 30% of their monthly income. These payments go into the Revolving Fund for Humanity to pay it forward, helping to build more homes. There is a less than 1% mortgages default rate. By providing a hand up, not a handout, the program prepares and empowers those served, which creates a better community for everyone who lives here.

Learn easy machine embroidery techniques called satin stitch bars and beads, chicken tracks, and drizzle to appliqué and embellish quilts, using the zigzag stitch in automatic and free-motion modes. These techniques create a range of moods from elegant to playful, while the drizzle technique is a great one for raw-edge appliqué, especially on sheer fabrics.

NORTHWEST QUILTERS SUMMER RETREAT - JULY 22nd-July 25, 2018

Mark your calendar and register for the Northwest Quilters Summer Retreat at Tilikum Retreat Center. Northwest Quilters Summer Retreat is just like adult summer camp so come and enjoy! The facility hums with day campers enjoying the wonder out of doors and it is always a delight to hear the children's voices and to watch them learn new skills. Retreat attendance is limited to 38 attendees to ensure a lower level bed for everyone and plenty of room in the upper and lower work spaces.

Tilikum Retreat Center is located five miles outside of Newberg, Oregon in a beautiful location with comfortable accommodations, great food, and a very caring staff. The 92 acre campus is surrounded by vineyards and hazelnut orchards. Tilikum grounds offer hiking trails around a large lake and the retreat center offers great vistas from a beautiful deck. Northwest Quilters Retreats are always memorable with each retreat offering something new and special.

There are two retreat options: Option (1) Arrive any time after 4:00 pm on Sunday July 22nd for a fee of \$220.00. Included are Sunday dinner, all meals on Monday and Tuesday with a full brunch on Wednesday (8 meals). Option (2) Arrive on Monday, July 23rd any time after 9:00 am for a fee of \$190.00. This option includes lunch and dinner on Monday, all Tuesday meals and brunch on Wednesday (6 meals).

You will need to bring your own linens and towels. Pillows and blankets are provided and extra blankets are available. Other items you need to bring: your project(s), sewing machine in good working order, sewing supplies, and to make your room more personal one of your favorite quilts. Quilt cutting mats, four ironing stations and steamers will be available for everyone to use.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH - June, Sailboat Blocks

We offer options this month. You may make this boat block or use another boat pattern and size you prefer.

Fabric choices

A, B, C - sky, light blue

D - Sail, anything you want

E - boat, anything you want

F - water, blue

A - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" cut 2

B - 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" cut 1

C - 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" cut 2

D - 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" cut 1

E - 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" cut 1

F - 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" cut 1

- Draw a diagonal line corner to corner on the wrong side of the B and C squares

- Place the B and D squares right sides together

- Sew on the line. Trim 1/4" from the seam line.

- Press

- Place a C square on each end of the E rectangle

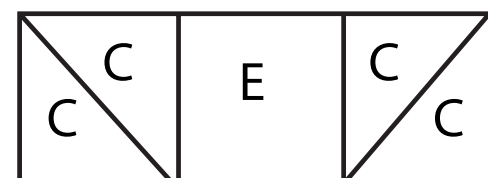
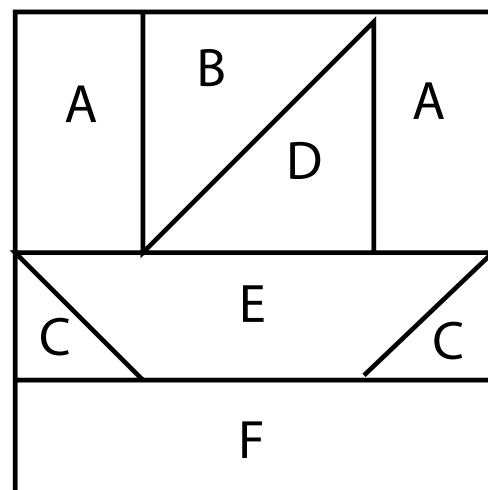
- Sew on the line

- Trim 1/4" from the seam line

- Press

- Sew the C/E/C unit to F

- Sew the A/B/D/A unit to the C/E/C/F unit

BLOCK OF THE MONTH - August, Scrap it up with Big Blocks

Fabric & supplies needed

- 1½" x 16" bright strips at least 7" long
- 2" x 8" bright strips at least 7" long
- Two 10" squares of black solid or black on black
- 6½" square ruler (optional)
- Sew at ¼" seam



Sew bright strips together. Make a set of 4 strips using the 1½" strips, add one each of the 2" strips to the right and left side, Press seams on one direction.

Use the 6 ½" ruler and trim down, make 4 of these sets and then make 1 large 4 patch. Make opposite corners vertical and horizontal. (see photo above).

Next, take the 10" squares x 2, cut corner to corner on the diagonal. Fold triangle in half, point to point to make a crease line. Line up the crease with the middle of the 4 patch seam. Sew the top and bottom, then right and left triangles. Press seams to the dark side, square up and trim the block leaving ½" at each point.

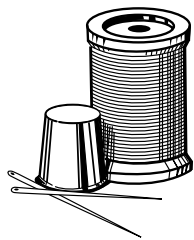
