ing Quilts, Quilts of Valor, retreats, guest speakers and even a Virtual Workshop.

We have even added a couple of new activities for members to participate in that may just stay around when this pandemic is over. Thursday evening Stitch N Chats and Saturday Stash-buster Sew Days give some members who are not able to attend meetings the opportunity to connect with other quilters.

Keep your chin up! Don't lose focus on the prize of being healthy and making our way through this. I can only imagine what it was like during the Spanish Flu of 1918, with folks isolated on farms, with no way to communicate with loved ones except via a handwritten letter. No phones, no television, no Netflix, and no Zoom to keep in touch.

# **COMFORTING QUILTS**

The February curbside drop-off and pick up was very successful. There were 230 items were turned in: 6 crib, 18 lap, 13 adult throw, 12 youth throw, 4 twin, 140 doll, 36 infant quilts and 1 pillowcase. Thank you to everyone and we especially appreciate the number of completed quilts that were turned in as we cannot hold workdays to process tops as this time. Our current need is for lap size quilts.

The March curbside service will be held on Tuesday, March 16 from 10:30 to 11:00 am. If you want supplies such as batting, backings or kits, you must notify Sue Hatt by Monday March 8. Please check the web site for further details.

Thank you letters have been received from Maryville Nursing Home (lap quilts for wheelchair patients) and from the Pacific Northwest Transplant Bank (lap quilts for the families of six patients who donated a total of 24 organs).

Recipient highlight: Habitat for Humanity is a unique organization – each Habitat homebuyer invests several hundred hours of "sweat equity" building their home alongside volunteers and participates in homeownership education classes. When construction is complete, they pay an affordable mortgage, which is invested back into the program to build more

homes. Children moving into their new homes receive a NWQ guilt.

Thanks to the enthusiastic supporters who joined us at the virtual Quilts of Valor National Sew Day on February 6th. We learned once again that "virtual gatherings" have their own unique challenges, no matter the organization, even the national Quilts of Valor Foundation. (And perhaps not quite so local -- we had members reporting in and sewing from Pennsylvania and Oklahoma.) Joyce Swift and Denise Gies continued putting together red/ white/blue quilts begun in the fabulous Krista Moser workshop. As one member commented, it was an opportunity to concentrate on their QOV projects, out of the many other works-in-progress that divide our attention.

It will be very informal -- you can wear anything comfortable, you can come and go as it works out for you, and we hope you will join us. - **Stitch and Chat** is every Thursday, from 6:30 to 7:30pm. Drop in and catch up!


**Show-and-tell:** 19 quilts were shown.

# "Make it Up as You Go" - A 2020 Stitch-a-Long - Third Pieced Round



## **Our Third Resting Border:**

Before we start choosing our pieced blocks, we are going to add the third resting border to our medallion.

Let's start with measuring again to make sure that your medallion currently measures **40** ½" **square.** If you are spot on, congratulations! If you are off a bit, don't panic... I have a formula for you that will bring you back to where we need to be before adding the pieced border.

You choose which of your fabrics you want to use... your background? One of your colors? Remember this is your quilt and you are making it up as you go!

Current Size	Cut your border strips
If your medallion is 40 1/2" square	Cut your strips 2 ½" wide - 2 @ 40 ½" & 2 @ 44 ½" long
If your medallion is 41" square	Cut your strips 2 1/4" wide - 2 @ 41" & 2 @ 44 1/2" long
If your medallion is 40" square	Cut your strips 2 3/4" wide - 2 @ 40" & 2 @ 44 1/2" long
Is your medallion is in between these measurements? 40 1/2" and 40 3/4"? Try this	You can over cut your borders just a tad, and then once they are applied, trim them just a smidge to bring you to the needed 44 ½" square. Just make sure they are trimmed equally so that they are all the same going around.

I pressed towards the resting borders, which will help reduce the seam bulk. After you have stitched on the resting border your quilt should measure 44 ½" square.

#### **Choosing the Third Pieced Round:**


Each month, we present two different pieced borders to add to your medallion. You can choose either one or the option you didn't choose the last time, or you can go rogue and pick something different. (Choosing to go rogue means you are on your own for block instructions.)

Round 3 Choices: 4" finished blocks Unfinished =  $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

#### You will need a total of 48 blocks for this round



These instructions are very simple, with no pictures. They are basic quilt blocks, and if you want to find detailed stitching instructions, look in one of your basic quilt books or check out Google & YouTube.

#### Flying Geese:

There are multiple ways to make Flying Geese. Search your favorite method to create the size below.

Make 48 of one color and 48 of your second color. (You could do all 96 the same, or go completely scrappy.) Remember, it's your quilt!

Trim if necessary to  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished. Stitch 2 geese together, both heading the same direction to create a  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished block. Be careful of your orientation so the geese fly the way you want them to go. Stitch into 2 rows of 11 blocks & 2 rows of 13 blocks

#### For "Diamond in a Square" Units:

For your center diamonds, start with accurate 3 5/16" strips.

Sub-cut into forty-eight (48) **3 5/16**" squares. (I know, it's not a typical ¼" increment, but it works!)

For each block, Cut two (2) squares  $3 \frac{1}{4}$ " of the color you want to put in the corners. Then subcut once on the diagonal. You will be cutting a total of 96 squares and finishing with 192 triangles.

To stitch, find the center of your diamond and your corner. Match the corners leaving a dog ear hanging off both ends and stitch. Do two opposite sides and press towards the center diamond. Clip off the dog ears.

Repeat for the opposite two sides, pressing towards the outside. Trim the dog ears.

Trim to achieve  $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished units. (Align your diamonds at the  $2 \frac{1}{4}$ " mark,  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from your outer edges.) If your unit is too small, use a narrower seam allowance. You should be able to trim about  $\frac{1}{4}$ " off of each side, still leaving a full seam allowance.

## Attaching your blocks to your Medallion:

Stitch into 2 rows of 11 blocks & 2 rows of 13 blocks

Attach to your medallion using a ¼" seam. Press towards the resting border you added earlier to reduce bulky seams.

## Your project will now measure 52 1/2" square.

I like to do a stay stitch 1/8" from the outside edge... this helps to keep my seams going the way I want them to, and keeps the seams from popping while we wait for the next steps.

PS. If your measurements are a bit off, don't panic! Don't cut off any points! We will be able to make that adjustment on your next resting border.

#### TaDa! Take a picture to send to Mary Fitzgibbons for Show & Tell!

I'm looking forward to seeing everyone's progress. The next and final round (#4) will be in the May Patchword.



Repurposing the classic churn dash block to make a flower.

**Fabric Choices:** 

Flower – Yellows, oranges Center of flower – Bigger print, coordinating color Background – White

Flower:

A – 4" x 4" Cut 2 (will yield 4 triangles)

B – 2" x 15" Cut 1 (this will be a bit oversized and trimmed later)

Center:

C – 3 ½" x 3 ½" Cut 1

Background:

D – 4" x 4" Cut 2 (will yield 4 triangles)

 $E - 2'' \times 15''$  Cut 1 (this will be a bit oversized and trimmed later)




Make ½ square triangle: Place one A square and one D square right sides together. Draw diagonal line. Sew scant ¼" seam on either side of diagonal line. See diagram. Cut along diagonal line. Open and press, then trim to 3 ½" square. Repeat with remaining A squares and D squares. Sew strips B and E together, then trim to make 4 squares, each 3 ½" x 3 ½".

Sew remaining pieces together following block diagram.


Finished size: 9 ½" x 9 ½" to make 9" quilt block.







Cut along diagonal line. Open and press, then trim to 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat with remaining B squares and C squares.






