

BLOCK OF THE MONTH - May, Scrappy 4 patch in a square, 6 1/2inch

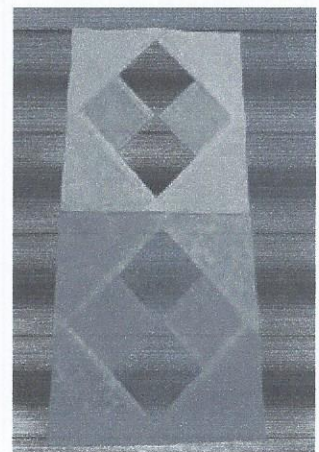
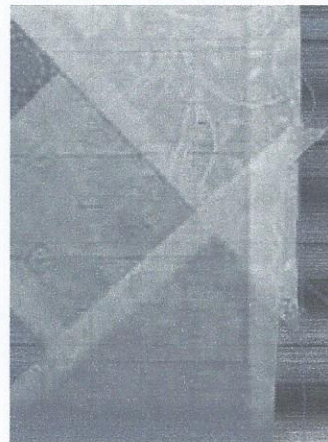
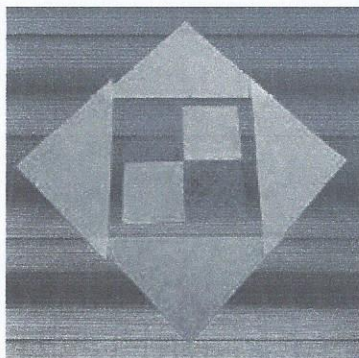
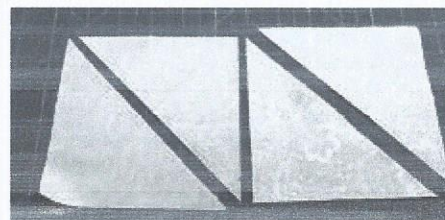
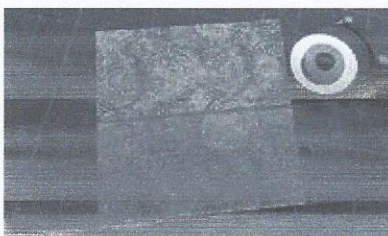
There are many ways to make a 4 patch, this is just one of them & my favorite way. Make a few, make a bunch, these are fast & fun.

Fabric needed for each 2 finished blocks

5 inch square dark or medium print x1

5 inch square of cream or neutral x 5

- ♦ Right sides together of the 1 cream & 1 print.
- ♦ Sew 1/4 inch seam of opposite sides of the RST 5 inch squares and press.
- ♦ Line up a ruler on the 2 1/2 inch line on the edge of the fabric.
- ♦ Cut in quarters, you will end up with 4 units, press to the dark side.
- ♦ Sew 2 opposite units to create a 4 patch.
- ♦ Stack the 5 inch cream color squares and cut on the diagonal once.
- ♦ Each block will need 4 triangles.
- ♦ Lay out the 4 patch unit & triangles, fold triangle in half, making a small crease, line up crease on 4 patch seam, sew top and bottom, then right & left
- ♦ Press and trim, lining up a 1/2 inch line on the tip of each point.
